From the Principal

Dear MISOTA families,

As we head into Term 2, some of the uncertainty we faced at the beginning of the year is now behind us and we can focus on teaching in these 'new normal' circumstances.

COVID-19 is something that continues to have a global impact, bringing isolation, social distancing and a greater reliance on internet and phones for business and personal events. Reflecting upon this from our rural and remote perspective, these are experiences that we are already very familiar with, particularly in Distance Education. This of course does not take away the seriousness of what lies ahead of us, but assures us that we as a school community understand more than most, the impact of COVID-19 conditions, and have experienced adversity in many forms in the past.

As a school staff, we used the Pupil Free Week and Week 1 and 2 to organise and prepare for these uncertain times, and we have prepared for continued delivery of distance education and also for any sudden changes to current programs and processes. Some staff worked from home, and this in itself made us develop online platforms for school operations that could be accessed offsite in a short period of time. Our staff all contributed in some way to create new processes, for when we moved one domino you can be sure the ripple effect incurred further change somewhere else.

Our Field Teachers, as were many of our other teachers, were itching to get out and about for home visits, but unfortunately, Government restrictions meant they had to stay put for a period of time.

The delivery of over 10 packs for Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) occurred in Term 1 and our staff soon needed to use them to test themselves for COVID. Luckily, the platforms we had in place ensured that many staff who were required to stay home and isolate, could continue to work from home, teaching their on-air lessons using the equipment they had taken home with them as a precautionary measure.

We started the year with 4 staff not able to return due to the no vaccination mandate. As I had discussed at previous P and C meetings, trying to recruit teachers and non- teaching staff to our school had proven difficult, however, we were able to introduce Miss Browning, Miss Caldwell and Miss Thompson to our team at the start of the year as well as welcome back for the 2022 school year, our returning staff.

In late February, COVID was not at the forefront of our minds, with the devastating floods ravaging SE Queensland and taking our thoughts away from the global pandemic for a short period of time. While we were not affected by school closures or loss of property or income, one of our students, Zander Wilson in Year 3 showed me what a true MISOTA student is like, by suggesting we gather any excess resources and write letters to send to schools who have lost resources during the floods. This notion of 'giving back' is wonderful and I was so proud to know that such kind thoughts were being had for people other than ourselves. Thank you Zander!

Head of Department

This year, we've seen some changes to the way we're delivering on air lessons. One of those changes has been the addition of Monday Mathematics tutorials in Years 1 to 6. Teachers and students have been practising essential Mathematics skills on air and are engaging with concepts that are coming up in lessons taught by Home Tutors and govies in isolated schoolrooms. It's wonderful to see students shine in these lessons, witness their confidence in Maths grow and to give them opportunities to share their new learning with their classmates. Often students learn more from their peers and we are seeing the benefits of these lessons from the students' perspective. They're also receiving affirmation and positive feedback immediately and regularly which is invaluable. I personally LOVE the Maths on air lessons and I can honestly say they make Mondays my favourite day of the week. Maths in the Western Alliance continues to be interactive, with teachers engaging students with opportunities to practise complex questions and again, working collaboratively with their classmates – how good is this working out?!





We've also, for the very first time, taught Science on air in Years 3 to 6. Students have had opportunities to engage in scientific conversations with their peers, explore living and non-living creatures, investigate different habitats, analysed environmental data and experiment with mouldy bread. In Year 3, students investigated living and non-living things, they also explored the relationship between the sun and the Earth. Check out the amazing work they did on air – how good is the detail in these scientific diagrams showing the rotation of the Earth! We've even had special guests visit MISOTA – thanks again for dropping by Bindi and Bob Irwin, Year 4 students loved listening to your thoughts on the life cycle of the frog.

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With Term Two comes the delivery of HASS lessons on air for Years 3 to 6, we can't wait to explore aspects of Australia and its history along with students.

As a school it is essential that we are kept up to date with who is the Home Tutor for your child at any given time. As a priority, if your Home Tutor or Governess/Governor details change at any time(this includes your contact details and address), please contact **Linda Ryan our MISOTA Community Wellbeing and Enrolment Officer** so that she can provide an induction to our school and make that initial contact. Linda can then also communicate this information with all the staff of our school (including the teachers, field team, administration team and mail room). Linda will, with their permission, pass on their contact details to other governesses so that a network of governesses can be formed.

There is a policy in place that we must notify parents if their child is absent from on air without explanation. If your child misses on air and we are unaware of why the absence has occurred you will receive an email from the school seeking an explanation. To avoid receiving the email please let your teachers know the reason why your child has missed on air. Occasionally we send these emails out in error as you have let someone know of your child's absence, if this happens please respond and let us know. *We apologise for these occurrences.*

Our teachers have also shared their daily timetables with families so that you can see the best time to make contact with them. During the school day our teachers have on air, reading and PLT commitments as well as other scheduled appointments – all of these are shown in their timetables which have been emailed to you. If you or your teacher have to miss a reading or PLT session this should be communicated in advance where possible.

We realise that prompt return of phone calls and emails is vital for your classroom operation. If your teacher is busy, please leave a detailed message so that he/she can respond in a timely manner with an effective/efficient response.

Daily Communique are our best method of communicating with our Home Tutors and we take this time to detail school news, upcoming events, timetable changes and staff absences. NAPLAN

Late last week, we received notice from QCAA that the majority of our students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 have approval to complete NAPLAN off-site. MISOTA families will be completing NAPLAN in their schoolrooms in Week 4 of Term 2.

For Home Tutors/parents/govies of students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9, we will hold two NAPLAN information sessions in Week 10 of this term, you only have to attend one. In this session, we will go through the steps to install the NAPLAN online lockdown browser that is required for the test. This session is **mandatory** if your child is participating in NAPLAN and we will be taking attendance. If you are unable to attend either of the live sessions, you must watch the recording then please email Luke or Di once you have viewed the recording so we can mark your attendance. <u>Ihugh124@eq.edu.au</u> <u>dknud3@eq.edu.au</u>

In Week 1 of Term 2, on Wednesday the 20th April, we will be running a compulsory practice test. More details about the session will be sent at the beginning of next term.

This session is **mandatory** and is essential for us to determine whether families have the necessary internet capability and that computers or laptops have the technical ability to complete the test off-site. The practice session will be open for 2 hours but the test itself can be ended in your schoolroom after approximately half an hour. We will have staff at MISOTA facilitating and supervising this practice test and will be available to answer questions on the phone.

Who must attend?

The student/s who is/are sitting the NAPLAN test in Week 4 of Term 2 and the supervisor (Home Tutor, parent or govie) **must be present for this practice test**. If you have more than 1 student in Years 3, 5, 7 or 9, you will only need one person to log into the Blackboard session but each student will need a computer/laptop to test the NAPLAN platform.

What is it?

The purpose is to give students and supervisors a feel for the NAPLAN platform, try a few practice NAPLAN questions and to ensure you are able to navigate through and utilise the tools.

When is it?

In Week 1 of Term 2, on Wednesday the 20th April at 8:30am (session may run for up to 1 hour).

We are wanting all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 to log in at the same time for this practice test to investigate the system's ability. If we find that it is struggling with this number of students, we may have to split the NAPLAN test into sessions for smaller groups for the real test in Week 4.

While this test is happening, there will be no other on air lessons, reading or PLT sessions running at MISOTA. This is to mimic what will happen during the real NAPLAN test and to reduce internet and technology issues.

Connecting and Learning through Music

Music plays an enormous role in the everyday in eKindy. We sing, listen to others sing, incorporate dance, movement, games, and imagination, and generally have a great deal of fun in the process.

Music also plays an important role in children's development and learning. During music activities, children learn to engage and focus, as they become ready to learn new actions and words - and to join with others (their siblings, Govies or parents) to enjoy the experience.

Children are social learners and music sessions provide a perfect format to interact, have-a-go at something new, be brave, work towards finding a sense of belonging and be part of the whole group (during our Activity Days).

- Learning new songs and rhymes introduces children to different vocabulary, word sounds and syllables and pronunciation.
- It supports children's understandings about learning to listen and concentrate, to retain and recall information and then repeat back what they have heard.
- It creates opportunities to learn more about number value, counting, size, shape, time and patterning.

- Musical games and transitions can be used to promote executive function skills such as working memory and inhibitory control.
- Children begin to learn to distinguish the words from the actions (for example when we sing 'Open Shut' them, starting with hands closed on the 'open' part).
- Music helps children to remember parts of the kindy routine (our Welcome and Goodbye Songs), to learn each other's names and to support afternoon rest and relaxation time after a busy day playing.
- It helps us to realise that we are all different but all part of a community.

Singing and dancing is a feel-good experience. It makes us joyful and tunes our hearing to rhythm and beat. It builds muscle strength coordination and balance and supports health

muscle strength, coordination, and balance, and supports healthy brain development.

We are free to sing - it costs us nothing, but the rewards are endless. So be a great role model to your child(ren), sing or hum out loud... in the car, in the shower, at bedtime or when you are playing together.

Instrumental Music

In conjunction with activities days, the MISOTA String Ensemble had their first practice leading up to the regional heats of the 2022 Fanfare competition being held in Mount Isa on the 20 May. Fanfare aims to

- promote excellence in ensemble performance
- highlight school-based ensemble performance offer students and teachers of ensembles the experience of expert adjudication
- provide students and teachers with the opportunity to perform in a music festival with ensembles from other state schools.

We are looking forward to practicing at the May activity days, and our performance on the 20 May. In Term One, we also had students attend the inaugural State Honour Ensemble Program in Longreach. This was a wonderful weekend of community music and we are looking forward to supporting this program in the future.

Home Visits

Class teachers are excited and would love to visit you and your family! This year, class teachers will be taking the lead to conduct home visits in addition to the field team. We aim to conduct a home visit within our designated enrolment area of Hughenden, Julia Creek, Cloncurry, Birdsville, Boulia, Bedourie, Camooweal, Burketown and Normanton at least every two to three years.

Home visits are a fabulous way to help your children, home tutor and govie feel connected to their school. Children love showing off their home, station and classroom and once this connection is established, it can positively influence

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their attitude to learning. It is also the perfect opportunity to access extra ideas and support for the home tutor or govie to implement in the isolated school room.

If you are approached for a home visit, don't be concerned, we are not checking up on you. Our focus is supporting learning – ours, yours and your student's. Instead embrace it and take as much from it as you can. Note, we can also make further arrangements to accommodation.

Minischools - Mind, body, Soul

Each year, the school conducts six minischools which are held in the field over one-week periods. This year these are conducted at Normanton, Boulia, Cloncurry, Camooweal (MISOTA Outstation), Julia Creek and Gregory. Families are invited to attend one of these and it is important to let the field team know which one you wish to attend via the parent consent form. Parent Consent forms are online and available on the MISOTA Home Tutor Site and are due in by 9:00am Monday 30th May to assist with staffing decisions.

The week provides the opportunity for children from eKindy to Year 6 to mix and learn together in a central location.

eKindy Arrangements

We are planning that the eKindy Teacher from BSDE will be able to attend our Minischools where the bulk of eKindy students are attending. Due to group size and staffing ratios, students may need to attend specific days as advised by the eKindy Teacher. A Kindy program may not be able to be offered where the eKindy teacher is unable to attend.

Mailing Room

Below are a few reminders regarding our MISOTA 2022 mailing system. Please keep this note in a handy place for future reference.

Three blue satchels are allocated to your family. They remain the property of Mount Isa School of the Air and should be returned at regular intervals and at the end of your enrolment here. The laminated address label should always be reversed and "tucked in" and the bag 'sealed' by using the zip tie provided before returning the mail satchel to Mount Isa School of the Air. Postage is reply paid. If you have 3 bags at home, please return an extra one with your mail, I usually have more mail to send to you than you have to return.

Mail is sent to you once per week on either Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays. I try to line this up so you get your mail as quickly as possible. Mail should only be sent to us once a week. If all your return mail does not fit into a blue satchel, you can either use two satchels or pack the lot in a box. Please do not use a separate blue satchel for each child in your family. It is not necessary.

If you are a travelling family and are not at the same address for any length of time, it is your responsibility to advise mailroom staff of your new address and how long you will be there. Please keep in e-mail contact.

If you are consistently receiving your mail in a post pack bag not a blue satchel, you can assume that I don't have a blue bag here for you. If you don't have any either, let me know and I will organise more for you. Post pack bags can be returned if they are in good condition, I will use them again if necessary.

If you don't have a blue satchel or only an envelope is required, it is quite okay to use our reply-paid address:

When returning work or USB to your child's teacher, please ensure it is packed inside a plastic bag/book/folder with your child's name and teacher marked on the front of the bag/book/folder. Loose items inside should also be marked with your child's name.

- Please mark miscellaneous items for other staff with their name and your name. This is especially important if you have sent payments. <u>Australia Post recommends that cash not be sent in the post</u>.
- Govies please when e-mailing school staff, reference the families for whom you are working. Station names are not always recognised by all staff.
- Please keep personal items to be forwarded to other families to an absolute minimum. <u>School will not be</u> <u>responsible for the postage of these items.</u>
- Please keep resource books inside the plastic bag provided for protection from dust and water. (Please keep these resources as clean as possible. Dust them off before returning and have clean hands before lessons. Other students will receive these packs after you.) The pack also lists what is to be returned so it and the contents should be kept together. It is highly recommended that these packs are checked and contain all marked items.
- Please return the entire pack as soon as you are finished with the contents (at the end of that unit).
- Please do not keep these packs longer than necessary. All items marked on the front of the pack should be
 returned inside the pack. Don't send them back early! If an item is damaged please leave a note on the front of the
 pack. It is a good idea to keep all items inside the resource pack on a daily basis, they will be less likely to get lost
 or damaged.
- Please advise Linda of all contact details, including new mail days, if they change. If you have satchels with the incorrect address on them please correct them before sending them back to school.

If you are coming in to school and want to collect your mail please let me know and I will hold it for you. If you are attending an activity day, mini-school etc. outside Mount Isa and want to collect your mail there, please let us know and we will endeavour to get it to you via our attending staff.
