I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our community members who have worked tirelessly throughout the year to ensure that our students are supported to achieve their best.


With eagerness, and anticipation, I hope that you look forward with us to 2025 with a real want to engage with our 'Back to our Roots' theme.

V9 Head of Curriculum

V9 Mathematics is ready to roll out for 2025! When you receive your Term 1 resources, please take a bit of time to look through the new Maths Independent Learning Materials and read the first few of pages of the Home Tutor Guide. Within these pages, you will find a summary of the unit, the lesson sequence, resources required and descriptions of what to find in the units.



At the start of the Term 1, 2025, we will step Home Tutors through the new layout. Please bring along any questions you may have about the new ILMs.

Some of the key changes in the V9 Australian Curriculum for Mathematics are:

- a stronger focus on students mastering the essential mathematical facts, skills, concepts and processes, and being introduced to these at the right time
- strengthened the focus on students developing the mathematical processes of mathematical modelling, computational thinking, statistical investigation, probability experiments and simulations.
- raised standards by introducing content earlier (for example lifting standards in Year 1 in relation to addition and subtraction, with additional content setting expectations about recall and proficiency with multiplication facts, beginning in Year 2) expanding depth and/or breadth of content and including new content.
- re-sequenced content to strengthen the developmental progression of key mathematical concepts, skills, procedures and processes based on evidence, a stronger focus on students
- mastering the essential mathematical facts, skills, concepts and processes, and being introduced to these at the right time
- making clear what mathematical computations need to be done without a calculator, reinforcing the importance of achieving proficiency in foundational skills
- a revision of the sequencing of content in Mathematics; in particular, telling time, introduction of fractions, recall of multiplication facts ('times tables') and solving equations
- lifting standards for Mathematics in Year 1 in relation to addition and subtraction, with additional content setting expectations about recall and proficiency with multiplication facts, beginning in Year 2

As you are teaching your students the Maths using the V9 ILMs in 2025, you may notice your student not doing something that an older child you've taught did when they were in that grade. For example, you may wonder: 'Why haven't I taught my Year 1 child about digital clocks this year?' This is because some V9 changes include changing when certain skills are being taught (as described in the key changes above). Students now won't need to be explicitly taught digital clock concepts until Year 3. The same is true for the reverse scenario – expectations around number knowledge have increased, particularly in the early year levels. As an example, by the end of Prep, Year 1 and Year 2, students will be expected to make connections between numbers up to 120, up to 999 and up to 9 999 (respectively).

As well as creating the ILMs to align with these changes, we have made some changes to our Maths boxes to support students as they engage with V9 concepts. These will now be sent as Prep, Year 1-3 and Year 4-6 Maths boxes. This was quite a big undertaking so thank you to families for sending these back early so Cherryl and Lhen could make the required changes in time to send Term 1 resources.

I'm excited and thankful that the project has been given another year to work on completing these Maths ILMs. Writers have worked hard to provide quality lessons for our students, and I'm grateful to work with this team of people moving into next year. Wishing everyone a wonderful long break and looking forward to what 2025 brings!

MISOTA Invoices, Payment Options & Dunning Information


Library


Welcome to the MISOTA Library! The library is open and available to the whole school community. Mrs Gowland, your T.A. Librarian, is here to assist you from 8.30am to 2.30pm, Monday to Thursday, and can be contacted directly on (07) 4744 8352 or sgowl0@eq.edu.au.

BORROWING LIBRARY BOOKS:

Mrs Gowland is responsible for library book selection and chooses the books for students! A Library Response Sheet is attached to all library books loaned out. When students fill in the Library Response Sheet, this helps identify what students are willing to read, for example, personal favourites, topics, series, hobbies, etc. Help Mrs Gowland to help you with your selection!

There is another wonderful way to choose library books by way of students accessing MISOTA's library OLIVER website found on the QLearn platform. This allows students to login and browse resources, be kept up-to-date with any library events, view any new items, see what's on loan/overdues and allows students to choose and reserve library books, puzzles, games, etc. (these are then posted to families in the blue mailbag).





LIBRARY BAGS:

It is important to return our library books in a bag to protect the books. They are individually labelled with student's name and mailed out according to bags returned. School library bags are available to purchase from the office for \$6.00...or feel free to provide your own!

Overdue library books: please take note of the date when library loans are borrowed and are due back.

Returning items by the due return date ensures that they are available for others to borrow - especially important with books from a popular series! Any books that are lost or damaged will incur a cost for replacement.

SORA – QLD EDUCATION eBOOKS DIGITAL LIBRARY:

All MISOTA students have been registered to Queensland Education eBooks Digital Library for 2025, and have access to borrow digital books. To login, open this link https://soraapp.com/library/eduqueenslandau and, when prompted, enter your MIS ID.

The eBooks Digital Library contains over 80,000 eBooks and audiobooks, including fiction and non-fiction reading, magazine materials, etc., which you can borrow and read at home, at school, on your PC or laptop. You can also access the collection by downloading the free Sora app on your mobile device.

ICPA Mt Isa BOTA - Isolated Children's Parents' Association QLD, Mt Isa Branch of the Air

ICPA Qld is a voluntary and apolitical not-for-profit organisation with 45 branches in Queensland and over 1200 member families. Our members encompass a broad range of families - those who are regional, rural and remote, those with children preschooling, attending state schools, boarding schools or Schools of Distance Education, as well as those with students in the tertiary phase of their education. Our members are families who are passionate about ensuring their children will not miss

out on educational opportunities due to their geographical isolation. Our Mt Isa Branch of the Air (BOTA) has over 58 members currently from remote properties (stations) in most areas surrounding Mt Isa including Camooweal, Normanton, Burketown, Cloncurry, Mt Isa, Boulia, Julia Creek and across the state border into the Northern Territory. The Branch welcomes anyone with an interest in equity to access of education for geographically isolated children to be part of our branch, whether they live in town or further out. We have been lucky to have many members over the years make the commitment to attend both State and Federal Conferences. We feel it's so important for our members to contribute to the decision making of ICPA and participate in the discussions and debate at these conferences.

We donate an ICPA Citizenship Award to a deserving student of MISOTA at graduation every year. Another initiative of our branch is coordinating the Sports For Bush Kids (SFBK) program conducted at the end of every school year in Mt Isa. Children and families come together for four action packed days of teams sports and swimming lessons. A huge thanks to the Coordinator, Fundraising Officer and the rest of the SFBK Committee for your efforts at hosting such a great event for our geographically isolated children.

MIOSTA's Move to Microsoft Teams in 2025
